## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another year goes by and the JCAA continues to be an important part of the diverse cultural fabric of Calgary. For the last administrative year, there were several initiatives that were triggered as we continued working to reaching further into the community. We continued our efforts to be more visible in the community by promoting the association at Riddim West (by Reggaefest), Business Extravaganza, Carifest and Unghanasia by Woezo Arts.

The major events hosted by the association in 2018-2019 were our New Year's Eve Gala, Taste of Jamaica, Jamaica 57 Independence celebrations and the Summer BBQ. As part of the Taste of Jamaica expo, this year we added an Investment Seminar where, in conjunction with Jamaica National and JAMPRO, we shared



information on economic activity and investment opportunities in Jamaica. It was a promising initiative with much potential.

During the year we continued our participation in the Caribbean Black History Month celebrations (in collaboration with the other Caribbean associations). The growth of this event continues to validate the value of working alongside our other Caribbean sister organizations. We also continued to be the primary

convenor of the Caribbean Presidents' Forum. All these investments ensured that the JCAA continues playing its role in the wider community. The JCAA was present in the Carifest parade. Our numbers were lower than in 2018 however we considered it important to be part of a successful Carifest

Jamaica's 57<sup>th</sup> anniversary of political independence was celebrated through three events, a church service at the Berean International Church of God, a flag-raising ceremony at City Hall and a civic ceremony held at the Evergreen Community Spaces. During our civic ceremony we recognized the 2018-2019 scholarship recipients. This year the association awarded nine (9) scholarships valued at \$1000 each.

We also continued our efforts to acquire an operating location. An offer was placed on a location at 609 33<sup>rd</sup> Street NE. We recently received approval from the City of Calgary for the building use and initial design. Once the legal paperwork is completed, the JCAA will be the owner of a place to "call our own". There is a lot of work to have this location ready for use in 2020 and we are excited about the opportunities for engagement that having this location offers.

During the year, the Benevolent Fund was formally launched. This fund provides a dedicated pool of funds to support members of our community in time of difficulty and fits within our strategic plan. There were three disbursements from the Benevolent Fund during the year.

Several areas of the association's operations remain a source of challenge and frustration. We are still struggling to get a youth program built and executed. Our marketing, branding and social media strategies and practices are either weak or non-existent. The broadening of our revenue streams and having successful fund-raising events have not been consistent. We still have a lot of work to do and need more skilled and committed people to get it done. That said, the JCAA has a role to play in Calgary and beyond. It is critical that we accept that challenge and dedicate our energies to playing that role well.

#### **New Year's Eve Gala**



Another great time was had by all at our 2018 NYE Gala held at the Executive Royal Hotel. This was another financially successful event for us with 175 tickets sold. The event received great reviews for the energy, food and overall vibe that it provided. It has also become a calendar event for many non-Jamaican patrons in addition to the many repeat attendees. We look forward to having another great event to end 2019.

#### **Caribbean Black History Month Celebrations**

As was done in 2018, our association collaborated with other Caribbean associations to promote our culture during Black History Month. On February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018 there were numerous presentations that exposed the perspective of the Caribbean community to Calgary. The event held at the Evergreen Community spaces featured a guest speaker and a panel discussion. The JCAA also had a display and information booth at the event.



#### **Taste of Jamaica**

The annual showcase of Jamaican culture continued with another full offering of our culture to the Alberta community. The event was highlighted by Juno Award winner Nana McLean who showcased her outstanding talent to the delight of the patrons. This year, Taste of Jamaica also included an Investment Forum in partnership with Jamaica National and JAMPRO. This event was well received and shared valuable information with the community. A talent hunt, Spotlight, was also added to this year's event. The auditions were held at the new Central Library. Unfortunately, there were not enough entrants to deliver on our desired goal. Overall a good event was produced. The JCAA is grateful to its sponsors, partners, suppliers and volunteers for the part they played. We did not meet our financial objective for the event which had an impact on other programs supported by the association. While this event has been going on for nearly 30 years, there is need to revisit it's format for future editions of this cultural showcase.







#### **Jamaica 57th Independence Celebrations**

As with previous years, the JCAA celebrated Jamaica's anniversary of gaining political independence with three events. On July 28<sup>th</sup> a church service was held at the Berean International Church of God. Pastor J. Hackett and the congregation did a fantastic job hosting us. On Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup> a flag-raising ceremony was held at City Hall where the Jamaican flag flew for the day. Later that evening a civic ceremony was held at the Evergreen Community Spaces where the Alberta Minister of Culture Multiculturalism and Status of Women, Leela Aheer brought greetings on behalf of the Government of Alberta. During the ceremony the 2019 scholarship recipients were recognized as were the recipients of the 2019 President's Award. Heather Harding, Anice Thomas and Olive Lewis were this year's President's Award recipients. The evening was capped by several cultural performances and a serving of great Jamaican food.








## SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY
